Geographies of Myth and Places of Identity Marco Benoît Carbone, 2022-01-13 Turning to a region of South Italy associated with Greater Greece and the geographies of Homer's Odyssey, Marco Benoît Carbone delivers a historical and ethnographic treatment of how places defined in public imagination and media by their associated histories become sites of memory and identity, as their landscape and mythologies turn into insignia of a romanticised antiquity. For the ancient Greeks, Homer had set the marine monsters of the Odyssey in the Strait between Calabria and Sicily. Since then, this passage has been glowing with the aura of its mythological landmarks. Travellers and tourists have played Odysseus by re-

enacting his journey. Scholars and explorers have explained the myths as metaphors of whirlpools and marine fauna. The iconic Strait and village of Scilla have turned into place-myths and playgrounds, defined by the region's heritage. Carbone observes the enduring impact of Hellas on the real Strait today. The continuous rekindling of cultural and visual traditions of place in the arts, media, travel, and tourism have intersected with philhellenic historiographies, shaping local policies, public histories, views of development, and forms of Hellenicist identitarianism. Elements of society have celebrated the landscape of the Odyssey, appropriated Homer as their imagined heirs, and purported themselves as the original Europeans—pandering to outdated ideological appropriations of 'classical' antiquity and exclusionary, West-centric views of the Mediterranean.

La monetazione di Reggio magnogreca Susanna Silberstein Trevisani Ceccherini, 2016-02-03T00:00:00+01:00 Il volume costituisce una sintesi della produzione monetale di Rhegion, limitatamente a quella emessa fra il IV e il I sec. a.C., e ne illustra i vari aspetti - da quello cronologico, metrologico e tipologico-iconografico a quello relativo alla sua ampia diffusione - effettuandone anche utili confronti con altre monetazioni coeve, soprattutto della Magna Grecia e della Sicilia. Queste emissioni si concentrano nei due secoli che intercorrono dall'anno 356 a.C., in cui Dionigi II si stabilisce nella polis, fino al momento della chiusura della zecca, evento che viene qui datato intorno alla metà del II sec. a.C. Un periodo dunque che abbraccia momenti decisivi della storia di Rhegion, dalla sua alleanza con Roma (282 a.C.) e l'acquisizione dello status di civitas foederata (270 a.C.), fino al coinvolgimento nelle due prime guerre puniche (264-241 a.C. e 218-202 a.C.), che segnano l'inizio del suo passaggio da un ambito culturale prevalentemente greco a uno, in cui la scelta della polis si sposta

progressivamente verso il mondo romano, pur mantenendo i tratti fondamentali delle proprie radici. L'esame di oltre 4000 monete, emesse dalla zecca reggina durante questo arco temporale, permette di individuare 44 serie, che vengono ripartite in otto Periodi. Ne risulta un quadro di riferimento per le singole serie monetali, per ciascuna delle quali, oltre a un suo inquadramento storico, viene effettuata una dettagliata descrizione analitica, con l'intento di fornire a studiosi e ad archeologi uno strumento interpretativo di questa monetazione. A tale proposito vengono anche indicate le diverse posizioni sostenute da vari autori sui singoli problemi, dando così una puntuale bibliografia relativa agli argomenti trattati. Il testo è concepito come opera di consultazione e di approfondimento scientifico, ma può anche essere letto – grazie alla chiara articolazione con cui si susseguono le varie tematiche – da quanti desiderino avvicinarsi ai problemi e ai metodi della numismatica classica, esaminandone da vicino un concreto modello di monetazione, storicamente ben delimitato, qual è quello preso qui in considerazione. Il volume si conclude con una Postfazione di Ermanno A. Arslan – dal titolo “Note, riflessioni e problematiche inerenti alla monetazione di Rhegion dal IV al I sec. a.C., nel quadro dei suoi rapporti con Roma, e delle realtà politiche, economiche e culturali del mondo magnogreco” – che aggiunge nuove considerazioni e stimoli per ulteriori approfondimenti e ricerche.

On Site Diagnostics for Architectural Conservation and Restoration Alessia Bianco, 2017-06-13 The topic of on site diagnostics for historical, monumental and vernacular architecture is characterized by a twofold difficulty, partially due to a sort of hiatus between scientific community and professional system. In fact, on one side universities and research centres produce advanced technologies, methodologies and procedures, but not always adequately disseminated among professionals and sometimes inconsistent with some relevant criteria, such as feasibility and cost-effectiveness. On the other side, professionals, in the field of on site diagnostics for historical architectures, are holder of a heritage, made of experiences and practice, which often is not enough shared and sometimes is contrasting with the limited possibility to evaluate and verify the professional training and certification system, which seems too heterogeneous, if compared to other high scientific and technical professions, as is the case, for example, of medicine or engineering. In this book the diagnostic experiences are described, though, for logistical reasons, often briefly, following a systematic methodological approach, according to three of the main steps for the knowledge of historical buildings: anamnesis, diagnosis and prognosis, obviously with particular attention to the specifically diagnostic issues (diagnosis), but framed in the preliminary diagnostic plan and interpreted in the light of the performance, prefigured in the preliminary stages and connected to the visual inspection. That is why this book regards not only some experimental, unconventional and innovative diagnostic surveys and diagnostic experiences, carried out on particularly valuable monumental buildings under the historical-architectural point of view, but also ordinary and simple experiences in the field of professional diagnostic practice, where, however, it was possible to apply the methodology and the know-how, acquired and systematized in the performance of the experimental diagnostic surveys, often included in

wider scientific research projects. This book is not exclusively addressing the scientific and academic community, but it also pursues the aim of disseminating in the professional system a heritage of rather varied experimental researches and practical experiences, but methodologically oriented toward a culture, which considers the design of diagnostic plans as a regulation criterion for quality control of professionals.

Acts Gerald L. Stevens, 2016-04-05 This analysis of Luke's post-ascension story of Jesus challenges orthodoxies in the interpretation of Acts and Paul. Carefully constructed narrative arguments from within the story in Acts use the themes of Pentecost, the Hellenists, and the character development of Saul-Paul to reveal Luke's insight that the future of the Jesus story is in the Hellenist movement realizing the promise of Pentecost in Israel. These Hellenists are at odds with the Jerusalem church on the implications of the outpoured Spirit of Pentecost. Further, the Saul-Paul of Acts is not what most readers presume from Paul's letters. For Luke, Paul finds his narrative significance in Acts only within the Hellenist movement and Pentecost fulfillment. Paul himself becomes Luke's premier example of the God active, God resisted theme of the speech of Stephen that drives the plot of Acts. This plot mechanism provides illuminating exegesis of Paul's insistence on going to Jerusalem from Ephesus with its dramatic conclusion in the shipwreck of Paul. Stevens concludes by integrating the ending of Acts into Luke's three major themes and overall narrative strategy--an impressive, compelling, and thoroughly fresh reading of Acts.

Romans Gerald L. Stevens, 2021-05-25 Stevens invokes a powerful synthesis of recent Pauline studies by insisting the category of Israel is the hermeneutical key to all of Romans. Through Jesus the Messiah and the power of the Spirit, Paul saw fulfilled Isaiah's vision of Israel's destiny to the nations to bring the good news of salvation. Recapturing Isaiah's vision broke the spell for Paul of the Great Assembly's postexilic take on Israel. Paul's apostleship first and foremost was to Israel, not gentiles exclusively. Paul used his exposé of the gospel of God in Romans to challenge believers in Rome to embrace their place in the messianic Israel of God.

Acts, Second Edition Gerald L. Stevens, 2019-08-05 This second edition of Stevens's presentation of Acts adds an extensive study of church traditions on Paul's death and burial. Uncovering of the sarcophagus in the Church of Saint Paul Outside the Walls yielded carbon 14 dated first- or second-century bones. In his characteristically creative way, Stevens offers an insightful proposal on why church traditions on Paul post Acts are so ambiguous and probably always will be, even with this new find. Stevens's close study of the Acts narrative analyzes Luke's post-ascension story of Jesus and challenges orthodoxies in the interpretation of Acts and Paul. Luke was the first to envision the future of the Jesus story in the Hellenist movement as this movement realizes the promise of Pentecost in Israel, preeminently epitomized in the mission of Paul, who

is Luke's premier example of the God active, God resisted theme of the speech of Stephen that drives the plot of Acts and illuminates exegesis of Paul's insistence on going to Jerusalem with its dramatic conclusion in the shipwreck of Paul. Luke ends Acts in Rome as intended—an impressive, compelling, and thoroughly fresh reading of Acts.
