The wars which began during the Revolution lasted until 1815 when Napoleon was defeated for the final time. The roots of the historical novel can be traced back to the early nineteenth-century. In 1814, Walter Scott published Waverley, or' Tix Sixty Years Hence, which is usually considered the first example of modern historical fiction. In this book and later works, Scott brought two key innovations to his representation of the past. Firstly, he focused on representing small details of everyday life, such as food, clothing, and architecture, in order to create an immersive experience for the reader. Secondly, he interwove the personal experiences of fictional characters with documented historical events. This combination of fact and fiction was very popular with audiences and authors in the nineteenth century. Major works of historical fiction from the period include George Eliot's Romola (1863), the novels of James Fenimore Cooper, Nathaniel Hawthorne's The Scarlet Letter (1850), and Victor Hugo's Hunchback of Notre-Dame (1831).
